The Department of Sociology at Purdue University (<https://www.cla.purdue.edu/academic/sociology/>) invites applications for a two-year Postdoctoral Fellowship to support the development of early-career scholars from diverse backgrounds with particular attention to historically underrepresented groups on the professorial faculties of colleges and universities in the United States. This year we seek applications from scholars who show promise in the area of **Health Disparities** and/or **Race, Family, and Adulthood**. Applicants will be encouraged to pursue their own research agenda during the fellowship for a portion of their time as well as work closely with a mentor. In addition to an annual salary of \$52,000, the fellowship provides office space, computer equipment, and a \$1,500 annual travel account. The application deadline is December 2, 2019, but applications will be considered until the position is filled. The anticipated start date summer or fall 2020. Prior to the start of the Fellowship, applicants must have completed the PhD in sociology or a closely related field such as demography, human development, sociomedical science, or public health.
