Research:

- Exploration of reclaiming agency through expressions of feminine rage by theatrical characters
- Initial research in writings on feminist theory by Hélène Cixous about the assignment of aggression to masculinity
- Examining the paintings of Artemisia Gentileschi versus Caravaggio in the tonal portrayal of active female destruction
- Field research was conducted in England through gallery visits, attending live performances, and analysis of theatrical archives
- Initially began as a larger examination of female anger across different media using different mediums, but was later focused to reflect the interpersonal connection of live theatre



Artwork:

- Designing and constructing referential and original wearables worn in site-specific performances
- Wearables activated through creation of personas to self-liberate and abject
- Sites were chosen to reflect spaces of past strife for characters to find empowerment
- Mediums include sewing, embroidery, dyeing, beading, leather craft, and performance
- Documentation through photography and written personal reflection
- Foiling processes of creation and destruction



Clay Barczak, HITM/IDEA GRANT 2024

- Explores historical documentation of identity.
- Queer utopian critique of the contemporary and antiquated social structures.
- Contextual art historical analysis of political painters of years past.
- Exploration of queer symbols of resistance and abstraction as resistance.



- Extensive research on contemporary artists working in a similar vein (content and/or technically).
- Archival research in the humanities revolving around documentation of murders against queer individuals.
- Queer theory and it's alignment with Caravaggio.
- Archival research in the documentation of queer erotica.
