WHEREAS, the Student Senate has recently introduced a new set of templates for bills and 1 2 resolutions, as well as introducing a new system of cover sheets for items of business; and 3 WHEREAS, the Congress wishes to adopt similar templates to make the preparation of bills and 4 resolutions easier; and 5 WHEREAS, the COGS Internal Rules of Procedure do not currently provide for a standardized template for bills and resolutions; 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the 33rd Congress of Graduate Students at Florida 7 8 State University that: Rule 4.1 of the COGS Internal Rules of Procedure is hereby amended to 9 read: 10 Rule 4: Submission Of Bills, Resolutions, And Motions 11 1. Bills and Resolutions shall be the exclusive methods of the Congress expressing its written beliefs, opinions, wills, or orders. Bills and Resolutions shall be submitted to the Deputy 12 13 Speaker of Communications and the Advisor by email no later than noon on the Thursday 14 preceding an Assembly meeting, unless this rule is waived by the Speaker, Deputy Speaker of Communications, or a two-thirds vote of the Assembly. 15 16 a. Bills and Resolutions must have at least one Representative as a sponsor. 17 b. Bills must include a statement of the purpose of the bill.

Statute Revision or Addition 33rd Congress of Graduate Students

Bill #: 11

Sponsored by: Speaker Rowan

Date: February 3, 2025

Purpose & Description: A Bill to Clarify the Approval Process for Acts of the Congress, and to Revise the Process for Amending the Annual Budget and Accompanying Proviso.

Be it enacted by the Thirty-Third Congress of Graduate Students:

Section 1: Chapter 106 of COGS Code shall be amended to read:

Chapter 106 After-The-Fact Amendments To The Annual Budget

- 1. After the Annual Budget has been approved, an amount not to exceed \$500.00 monies may be moved within a line item between the categories of Salary, OPS Wages, Contractual Services, Expense, or OCO upon request of any COGS-funded entity by a majority vote of the Assembly. Such transfers of \$500 or less shall be deemed approved when, during New Business, the Deputy Speaker for Finance presents en bloc all pending transfers of \$500 or less and no Representative objects. If there is an objection, each bill shall be debated as normal. with the signatures of the Speaker, Deputy Speaker for Finance, and Vice President for Student Affairs or his/her designee.
- 2. Annual Budget proviso may be amended by bill.
- 3. COGS, by a majority vote of the Assembly, may make any lawful amendments to the Annual Budget it deems necessary, regardless of amount or category. Any such revision amendment to the Annual Budget, or its proviso, shall still require the signature of the Vice President for Student Affairs University President or his/her designee.

Section 2: Chapter 107 of COGS Code shall be amended to read:

Chapter 107 Amendments To The COGS Code Forms of Action

- 1. <u>Bills shall be used to amend COGS Code</u>, <u>Annual Budget</u>, <u>and Annual Budget proviso</u>. Amendments to the COGS Code shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of COGS.
 - 1. <u>Bills shall include a title which summarizes the bill, a short title for the bill, and shall include the enacting clause "Be it Enacted by the [Number of Congress] Congress of Graduate Students that:".</u>
 - 2. <u>Bills may include proviso language to take ancillary actions, including, but not limited to:</u>
 - 1. <u>Setting an effective date later than upon signature of the Vice President</u> for Student Affairs,
 - 2. <u>Issuing waivers under COGS Code (unless Code requires the waiver to be made by resolution),</u>
 - 3. Providing limitations on funds allocated by COGS,
 - 4. <u>Providing approval for COGS to enter into written agreements related to the bill.</u>
 - 3. <u>Bills amending COGS Code shall be signed in the following order after approval by the Assembly:</u>
 - 1. The Speaker, who signs in a ministerial capacity to signify the Assembly's approval of the bill,
 - 2. The COGS Advisor, who shall sign, in a ministerial capacity, within two (2) school days of receipt to signify receipt by the SGA Advising Staff, and
 - 3. The Vice President for Student Affairs, who has ten (10) school days from being presented with the bill to sign or veto the bill. Should the bill not be acted upon within the aforementioned time limit, the bill shall be deemed as approved and enrolled.
 - 4. <u>Bills amending the Annual Budget or its Proviso shall be signed in the following order after approval by the Assembly:</u>
 - 1. The Speaker, who signs in a ministerial capacity to signify the Assembly's approval of the bill,
 - 2. The Deputy Speaker for Finance, who signs in a ministerial capacity to acknowledge the amendment to COGS finances,
 - 3. The COGS Advisor, who shall sign, in a ministerial capacity, within two (2) school days of receipt to signify receipt by the SGA Advising Staff, and
 - 4. The University President or their designee, who has ten (10) school days from being presented with the bill to sign or veto the bill. Should the bill not be acted upon within the aforementioned time limit, the bill shall be deemed as approved and enrolled.
- 2. Resolutions shall be used to convey the opinion of the Congress, amend the Internal Rules of Procedure, and issue waivers (as required by Code). Resolutions shall be

signed by the Speaker, acting in a ministerial capacity, to signify the Assembly's approval of the resolution.

- 1. Resolutions shall included the following resolved clause: "Be it Resolved by the [Number of Congress] Congress of Graduate Students:".
- 2. The Congress may not enter into written agreements unless approved by resolution, except for those agreements allowed for in bill proviso.

<u>Section 3</u>: This bill shall be effective upon signature by the Vice President for Student Affairs.
