33rd Congress of Graduate Students Legislation Cover Sheet

COGS Bill #: 7

Sponsor(s): Speaker Rowan

Short Title: The Congressional Organizational Session Act of 2025

Summary of Legislation:

The bill amends Chapter 111 of COGS Code to establish organizational sessions at the start of each Congress to elect officers. The bills makes conforming changes to Chapter 117 of COGS Code to relocate language establishing the order of seniority when necessary to assume the chair at COGS meetings.

Background Information:

During the 2024-2025 Constitutional Review Commission, discussions began about implementing a series of organizational sessions for the Student Senate and COGS to each elect their leadership prior to fall inauguration. The Commission approved a proposed amendment that would place the Senate's organizational session in the Student Body Constitution.

The Florida Legislature currently holds an organizational session within two weeks of a general election in order to elect the officers of each body, establish rules of procedure, and complete other housekeeping business.

Effect of Proposed Legislation:

The bill requires that, no later than two weeks after the Fall SGA elections, the Supervisor of Elections certify the results of all COGS elections that do not have outstanding violations or contests. The bill provides the form for such certifications.

The bill would require that the Speaker call an organizational session at least two weeks after the fall elections. At this organizational session, the Congress would elect a Speaker, as well as several of the Deputy Speakers.

The bill further lays out a more formalized process for the election of a Speaker, including a requirement that candidates declare their candidacy through written form submitted to the

sitting Speaker and affirming that they intend to serve the entirety of their term. The bill provides the contents of such a form, which is attached (in final form) as Attachment #3.

The election process for Deputy Speakers will not change, as a result of this bill, except that the elections will take place at the organizational session.

Section 2 reinserts language from Chapter 111 into Chapter 117 that defines who the most senior member of the Congress is and how seniority should be tracked.

AN ACT

Establishing Congressional Organizational Sessions

- 1 Be it enacted by the 33rd Congress of Graduate Students at Florida State University that:
- 2 Section 1. Short Title

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- This act may be referred to as "The Congressional Organizational Session Act of 2025."
- 4 Section 2. Amendment to COGS Code Chapter 111, "Elections".
- 5 Chapter 111 of the COGS Code, entitled "Elections," is amended to read:
 - The SGA Supervisor of Elections shall be responsible for conducting elections for the Congress of Graduate Students. The Congress agrees that its elections shall be governed by the Student Government Election Code, as laid out in Student Body Statutes Title VII, except that the following procedures shall control for COGS elections, notwithstanding conflicting provisions of the Election Code:
 - a. COGS elections shall be non-partisan,
 - b. Candidates for COGS do not need to attend the Candidate Seminars,
 - c. Candidates for COGS shall file a combined Campaign Finance Statement by the Final Expense Statement deadline, as set out in Title VII, which shall include:
 - 1. An itemized list of all campaign contributions and expenditures, or
 - 2. A statement, under penalty of disqualification, that the candidate received no contributions, nor made any expenditures.
 - d. Any ties in a COGS election shall be resolved by a vote of COGS immediately upon the convening of the new Congress, taken by secret ballot, with the tied candidates being on the secret ballot.

21 e. No more than two weeks after election day, the Supervisor of Elections shall certify, in 22 writing to the Speaker, the election of all COGS representatives whose elections are not 23 under active appeal. This certification shall include, at minimum: 24 1. The date of the Supervisor's certification, 25 2. The name of each Representative certified as elected and their seat, 26 3. A statement of certification under the Elections Code and COGS Code, 27 4. The signature of the Supervisor and a witness, whose name shall be listed in print as well as the signature, and 28 29 5. The SGA seal. 30 2. COGS shall be composed of forty-three (43) seats with the following allocation: 31 32 a. Thirty (30) seats for the members of each college/academic unit, except for the College 33 of Applied Studies and Special Students, apportioned annually through the D'Hondt Method, based on the most recent annual population data for each college, as provided 34 35 by the University. 36 1. By the second COGS Assembly meeting of the Fall Semester, the SGA 37 Supervisor of Elections shall provide the Assembly, by memo and personal 38 appearance at the meeting, with a list detailing the number of seats apportioned 39 to each college/academic unit, as well as an accounting of the calculations used to determine the apportionment. Should the list not be provided by this deadline, 40 41 the COGS Executive Board shall be empowered to facilitate the apportionment in 42 the Supervisor's place. 43 2. Should there be a discrepancy that results in the erroneous allocation of seats, the Assembly may move to reject the apportionment and request that the 44 Supervisor (or COGS Executive Board, if providing the list under sub-subsection 45 (1)) provide a corrected apportionment to the Assembly at their next meeting. 46 Such motion requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote to pass and is debatable. 47 48 3. If no motion to reject is passed, the apportionment shall become official upon 49 adjournment of the Assembly meeting in which it is presented. 50 b. Six (6) advocate seats under the following titles: Graduate Student Housing Advocate, International Student Advocate, LGBTQ+ Student Advocate, Minority Student Advocate, 51 52 Veteran's Advocate, and Student with Disabilities Advocate. Any graduate student, 53 regardless of college, may serve as an Advocate, 54 c. Six (6) At-Large seats, which may be filled by any graduate student, regardless of 55 college, and 56 d. One (1) seat for the combined grouping of Special Students, the College of Applied Studies, and the Panama City Campus. Should this seat be filled, attendance by the 57 representative will count towards quorum, but failure to attend will not count against 58 59 quorum. 60 3. The Supervisor of Elections shall advertise the seat allocation information at least twenty-four

(24) hours before the first day of the Declaration of Candidacy date, as specified by the Student

- 62 Government Election Code. The Deputy Speaker of Communications shall also advertise the seats up for election on the Congress's social media pages. 63 64 4. Elections will be held in conjunction with the regular fall semester Student Government 65 elections. 66 5. All enrolled graduate students are eligible to vote in COGS elections. 67 6. Election appeals shall be made to the Student Government Elections Commission, as specified by Title VII. Appeals from the Elections Commission shall be to the Florida State University 68 69 Student Supreme Court. 70 7. Regular elections to the Assembly shall take place only during the fall semester. 71 8. Elections of the officers for COGS shall take place at an organizational session in which all 72 COGS members elected at the fall election may vote. Officers elected at the organizational 73 session shall assume office upon being sworn in at fall inauguration, on the first meeting of the 74 newly convened Congress. A Speaker and two other members of the COGS Executive 75 Committee must be elected before the first meeting adjourns. 76 a. The organizational session shall be held at least one week prior to Fall Inauguration and shall be called by the Speaker, within twenty-four (24) hours of the announcement of 77 78 COGS election results, by memorandum to the elected members and published 79 electronically to the public. The organizational session must occur at least two weeks 80 after the announcement of election results. 81 b. Upon the calling of the organizational session, the Speaker shall provide all elected 82 members with a form for the declaration of candidacy to the office of Speaker. Candidates for Speaker must complete the form and return the form to the Speaker no 83 84 later than forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of the organizational session. The form 85 shall be created by the Speaker and shall include: 86 1. The title "Declaration of Candidacy for Office of Speaker", 87 2. The statement "I, [NAME OF REPRESENTATIVE], do hereby declare my candidacy for the office of Speaker of the Congress of Graduate Students. I 88 89 affirm, on penalty of impeachment, that I am an enrolled graduate or professional 90 student at Florida State University, that I am duly qualified to hold office under the Student Body Constitution, that I will not graduate during the term I am 91 92 seeking election for, and that I intend to serve the entire one-year term.", 93 3. A signature and date line for the candidate to sign and date, 94 4. A signature, print name, and date line, entitled "Nominator", for the representative that intends to nominate the candidate, 95

 - 5. A signature, print name, and date line, entitled "Seconder", for the representative that intends to second the nomination of the candidate,
 - c. No later than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the start of the organizational session, the Speaker shall publish the names of all candidates for Speaker to the elected members.
 - d. The Speaker shall serve as Chair for the organizational session.

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101 1. Should the Chair be a candidate in the election of a COGS officer, the Chair shall 102 be assumed by the next eligible person in the Chapter 117 line of succession for 103 the purpose of that election. 104 e. The Speaker shall begin by tabling the certificates of election of COGS Representatives. 105 The Speaker shall then call the roll of Representatives-elect to determine whether a 106 quorum is present. Should a quorum be present, the Speaker shall immediately proceed 107 to the election of a Speaker for the next Congress. Upon the election of a Speaker, the 108 Chair shall move to the elections of the Deputy Speakers for Finance, Communications, 109 Judicial Affairs, and Advocacy, respectively. 1. If a quorum is not present, the Congress shall recess for fifteen (15) minutes and, 110 111 upon reconvening, call the roll of Representatives-elect again. If a quorum is still 112 not present, the Speaker shall adjourn the meeting and call another 113 organizational session to convene no later than seventy-two hours after the 114 noticed meeting time of the original organizational session. 115 f. A Speaker and two other members of the COGS Executive Committee must be elected 116 before the organizational meeting adjourns. 117 g. The Chair shall then move to a period of closing announcements, followed by the 118 adjournment of the meeting, upon the election of all members of the Executive Committee or upon a two-thirds majority vote of the members-elect to adjourn after the 119 requirements of paragraph (f) are met. 120 121 9. COGS officer election procedures shall be the following: 122 a. Members of the COGS Executive Committee shall be elected from among the 123 membership of COGS. Election shall be by secret ballot and shall require a majority vote 124 in order to elect a candidate. Quorum of the Congress must be present for the election of 125 each member of the COGS Executive Committee. 126 b. The most senior member of COGS who was a member of the previous Congress, based 127 on date of swearing in (ties broken by alphabetical order of last name), shall act as the 128 Temporary Chair for the first meeting of the new Congress until the Congress elects a 129 Representative to the Office of the Speaker, at which time the Speaker shall be sworn in 130 and chair the Congress. The Temporary Chair shall have the right to cast a vote for election of the Speaker in such cases where his/her vote would be decisive. 131 132 1. The COGS Advisor shall, with the assistance of the Deputy Speaker for 133 Communications, maintain a list noting the order of seniority among members of 134 COGS. 135 2. If all members who were a member of the previous Congress are candidates for Speaker, the Student Body President shall act as the Temporary Chair. 136 137 c. Nominations for Officers shall be taken from the floor and shall require a second. Each 138 candidate may accept or decline the nomination. After receipt of nominees, the Chair 139 shall close the floor for nominations, only after ensuring that no other nominations are to be made. If only one candidate is nominated, that candidate shall be declared to be 140 141 elected by acclamation. The elected officer shall then be allowed to make a brief 142 statement to the Congress. 143 1. At the organizational session, called pursuant to subsection (8), only those 144 candidates for Speaker who have returned a completed form, as specified in 145 subsection (8), to the Chair are eligible for nomination, unless no candidate

146 returns such form. The chair shall call upon the nominator and seconder listed in 147 each candidate's form to nominate and second the candidate. If the nominator or 148 seconder is not present, the Chair may take the nomination or second from any 149 other member-elect. 150 d. If there are two or more candidates who accepted their nomination, each shall be 151 allowed, in alphabetical order, to address the Congress for no more than two (2) 152 minutes. The Chair shall allow three (3) minutes of questions per candidate. No "con" 153 debate shall be permitted during the election process. All nominees not addressing or 154 taking questions from the Congress shall remain outside the COGS Chambers. Candidates shall not be present during debate on the candidates. Debate on the 155 156 candidates shall take no more than five (5) minutes. Motions to extend time for opening 157 addresses, questions and discussion of the candidates may be made by 158 Representatives in the Chambers and pass by a majority vote of the Representatives in 159 the Chambers. Once the question has successfully been called to vote on the position, 160 all nominees may enter the Chambers and cast their own secret ballots with the rest of 161 the Congress. 162 10. COGS Officers shall take the following oath prior to assuming office: "I, [NAME], do swear that I 163 will support, protect, and defend the constitution and laws of the United States, the State of 164 Florida, and the Florida State University Student Body; that I shall serve and protect the rights and interests of graduate and professional students; and that I shall carry out my duties, in the 165 166 role of [POSITION] of the Congress of Graduate Students, to the best of my abilities; so help me 167 God." 168 a. <u>Short Title:</u> A Resolution Congratulating the Student Body President on Being Elected Chair of the Florida Student Association and Proposing a Revision to Chapter 607, Student Body Statutes

Summary of Legislation:

The resolution congratulates President Carson Dale on his election as Chair of the Florida Student Association and proposes an amendment to Chapter 607, Student Body Statutes, designating the COGS Speaker as FSU's representative on the Florida Student Association's Graduate Student Committee.

Background Information:

The Florida Student Association (FSA) is the official nonprofit organization representing the more than 400,000 students in the Florida State University System.¹ The FSA's board of directors is made up of the student body presidents of the twelve state universities, who elect a chair from among themselves.² The chair of the FSA serves as a member of the Florida State University System Board of Governors, which regulates the entire Florida State University System.³

On May 30, 2025, FSU Student Body President Carson Dale was elected Chair of the FSA by the FSA Board of Directors. In consultation with Speaker Rowan, President Dale proposed an amendment to the FSA constitution that created a Graduate Student Committee, comprised of a graduate student representative from each of the twelve state universities. The amendment was adopted by the Board of Directors. As a result, FSU SGA needs to designate, by statute, an official to serve on the Graduate Student Committee.

Effect of Proposed Legislation:

The resolution congratulates President Carson Dale on his election as Chair of the FSA.

Additionally, the resolution proposes an amendment to Chapter 607, Student Body Statutes, which governs COGS. Per § 607.1(d)(1), SBS, COGS may directly propose legislation to Senate. When COGS proposes legislation, the legislation must be introduced by the Senate President or the Senate Judiciary Committee.

The amendment to Chapter 607 would designate the COGS Speaker as FSU's representative on the FSA Graduate Student Committee.

 - (1) To plan and coordinate the execution of all administrative work necessary for the efficient operation of COGS.

- 10 (3) To be empowered to represent the graduate, professional, and post-baccalaureate FSU Student Body officially within the university and serve as spokesperson for COGS.

 - (6) To perform other duties and responsibilities as delineated in the COGS Code.
