Short Title: The Big Bend Trumpet Day

Summary of Legislation:

This bill would fund the speakers' honorarium, food, and expenses to support the event

Background Information:

The Big Bend Trumpet Day celebrates young musicians through performances, educational programs, and community involvement. Held in Tallahassee, Florida, this event brings together talented middle and high school trumpet players from the Big Bend region for a day of learning, mentorship, and teamwork. Students will have the opportunity to work with experienced performers and teachers while enhancing their musical skills in a supportive, motivating environment. The event emphasizes the importance of music education and encourages connections among young musicians, college students, and professional performers. This event is organized in partnership with Trumpet Outreach for Youth Education (T.O.Y.E.), a nonprofit dedicated to increasing access to trumpet education and mentorship for young musicians. Through T.O.Y.E., the goal of this event is not only to offer performance opportunities but also to inspire students to view music as a path for personal growth, discipline, and artistic expression. By uniting students from various schools and backgrounds, the event seeks to build a strong, supportive community centered around music education. A key part of the event will be the participation of guest artist Dr. Raquel Samayoa, Associate Professor of Trumpet at the University of North Texas. Dr. Samayoa is a skilled performer and educator whose work has influenced trumpet students nationwide. Her presence will give students in Tallahassee the chance to learn firsthand from a nationally recognized artist and teacher. Through masterclasses, demonstrations, and performances, Dr. Samayoa will share insights into professional-level trumpet playing and encourage students to keep developing their musical talents. Throughout the day, participants will attend a series of educational sessions to strengthen core trumpet skills and foster musical growth. These sessions will feature masterclasses, ensemble rehearsals, and group discussions focused on key aspects of trumpet performance, including breathing, tone production, articulation, musical interpretation, and ensemble playing. Students will also have opportunities to perform for feedback in a supportive, motivating environment that builds confidence and artistic development. In many under-resourced communities, students often lack access to specialized music instruction and opportunities to engage with professional musicians. Big Bend Trumpet Day aims to address this gap by offering an accessible educational event that connects young musicians with experienced performers and educators. By creating a space where students can learn, perform, and collaborate, the event promotes ongoing participation in music education and strengthens the musical culture of the Tallahassee and Big Bend


communities. The event will also offer meaningful teaching and leadership opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students from Florida State University's College of Music. These students will help mentor participants, lead sectionals, and support the educational activities throughout the day. This experience will give Florida State University students a chance to apply their pedagogical training in a real-world setting, while developing leadership, teaching, and mentorship skills. They will also represent the College of Music in meaningful community engagement. Their involvement enables them to gain valuable teaching experience while contributing to the growth of younger musicians. The Big Bend Trumpet Day aims to inspire the next generation of musicians and strengthen connections among students, educators, and the wider music community. Through the partnership with T.O.Y.E., the event continues to demonstrate a commitment to empowering young musicians and advancing the future of music education in our community.

Effect of Proposed Legislation:

This legislation would fund The Big Bend Trumpet Day. This would provide graduate students with important professional development, teaching/presenting experience, and adjudication. All of which are important to graduate student success.

- **Educate:** Enhance understanding of the history, meaning, and traditions of Nowruz as an ancient celebration of renewal and the new year.
- **Unite:** Bring together students, faculty, staff, and the Tallahassee community to foster cultural exchange and mutual understanding.
- **Showcase Art & Tradition:** Highlight Iranian music, dance, storytelling, and traditional customs associated with the new year.
- **Build Community:** Strengthen connections among Iranian students and all who are interested in experiencing Iranian culture.





AN ACT

Adopting the COGS Fiscal Year 2026-2027 A&S Budget

Be it enacted by the 34th Congress of Graduate Students at Florida State University that:

Section 1. Adoption of the FY 2025-2026 COGS A&S Budget.

Pursuant to Chapter 208, COGS Administrative Code, the funds described herein, totaling \$1,396,738.91, are appropriated from constitutionally-apportioned Activity & Service Fee revenues for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 to the entities indicated.

These allocations may be altered or amended only by the prescribed procedures as contained in the Florida State University COGS Administrative Code and as approved by the Congress of Graduate Students of Florida State University.

Section 2. Adoption of the Proviso to the FY 2026-2027 COGS A&S Budget.

Pursuant to Chapter 208, COGS Administrative Code, the proviso language described herein is adopted and is binding on the named entities.

Proviso language to this Budget shall only be amended by COGS bill, pursuant to Chapter 208, COGS Administrative Code.

Section 3. Effective Date.

The provisions of this bill shall take effect on .

Proviso to the FY 2025-2026 COGS A&S Budget

- I. Student Organizations
 - A. School for Teacher Education Graduate Student Association
 1. T-shirts paid for with COGS funds must be available to the general student body.
- II. COGS Administration
 - A. Executive Committee
 1. The members of the Executive Committee shall be compensated at the following rates
 - a) Speaker: \$18/hr over 44 weeks at a rate of 10 hours per week. (\$7,920 total)
 - b) Deputy Speaker for Finance: \$15/hr over 44 weeks at a rate of 10 hours per week. (\$6,600 total)
 - c) Deputy Speaker for Communications: \$15/hr over 44 weeks at a rate of 10 hours per week. (\$6,600 total)
 - d) Deputy Speaker for Judicial Affairs: \$15/hr over 44 weeks at a rate of 10 hours per week. (\$6,600 total)
 - e) Deputy Speaker for Advocacy: \$15/hr over 44 weeks at a rate of 10 hours per week. (\$6,600 total)
 - B. Graduate Assistant
 1. The Speaker and Deputy Speaker for Finance are authorized to execute any agreements with the Department of Student Engagement to effectuate the hiring of a Graduate Assistant on a 0.25 FTE appointment. The Assistant's job responsibilities shall include, at a minimum, assisting the Deputy Speaker for Finance with administering the grants system and event planning. Should such a role not be hired by February 1, 2027, the funds allocated shall revert to COGS Reserves.
 - C. Speaker's Request
 1. The Speaker of the Congress of Graduate Students is authorized to use the Speaker's Request line-item to make emergency allocations that benefit the Graduate Student Body. Any allocations made by the Speaker from the Speaker's Request line-item shall be reported to the Executive Committee within twenty-four (24) hours of the allocation and to the Congress at its next regular meeting.
 - D. The Deputy Speaker for Finance, assisted by the Speaker, shall provide each budgeted entity with a memorandum outlining the funds allocated to them by the Budget, as well as any proviso language to such allocations. The memorandums may be sent any time after this Bill is signed by the University President, or their designee, but shall be finalized and sent by July 15, 2026.
- III. Conference Grants
 - A. For the 2026-2027 FY, the grants shall be allocated over three periods in which the following amounts are set aside for each period: Presentation Grants: \$130,000 between July 1 and October 31, \$130,000 between November 1 and February 28, and \$130,000 between March 1 and June 30; Attendance Grants: \$13,000 between July 1 and October 31, \$13,000 between November 1 and February 28, and \$13,000 between March 1 and June 30.
- IV. Severability

- A. Any line item or proviso, or any part thereof, of this Bill is severable. The Congress shall be informed during their next regular meeting if any person deems any part, provision, or representation of this Bill prohibited, void, or unenforceable at any time.
