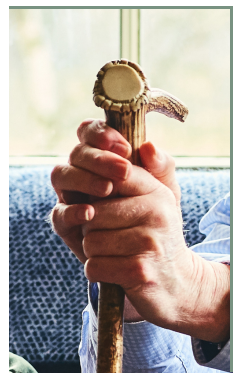

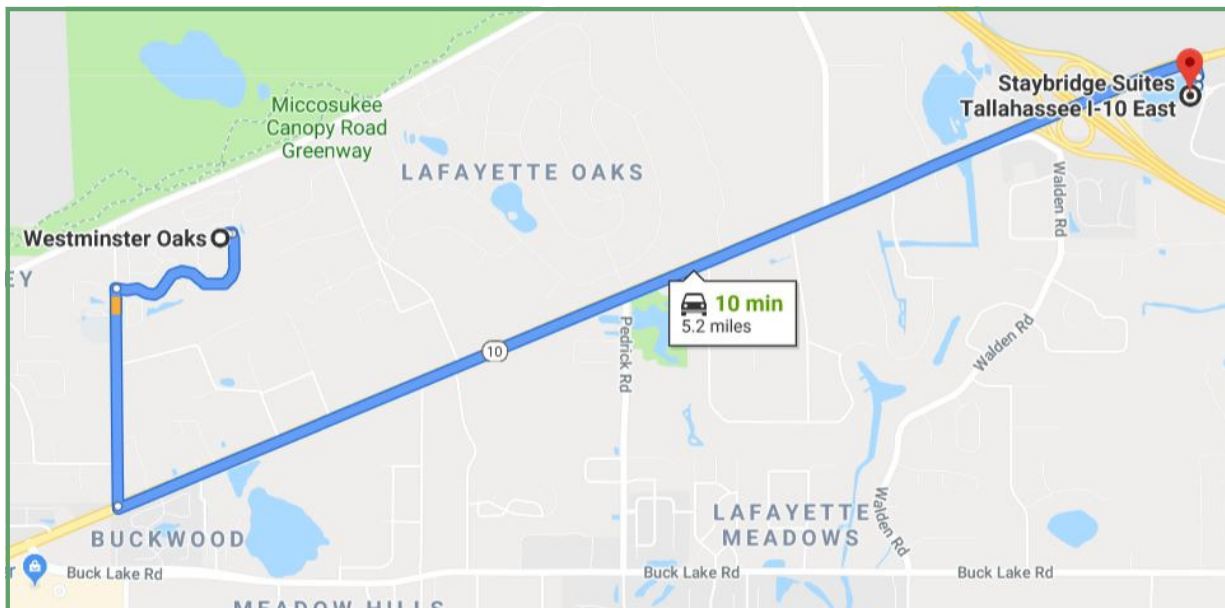

Meet Our Presenters

Keynote: Wendy Lustbader, MSW



Ms. Lustbader is an Affiliate Associate Professor at the University of Washington School of Social Work and teaches courses in multigenerational studies. She is a skilled psychotherapist, having worked almost 20 years at a community clinic in downtown Seattle. Some of her publications include *Taking Care of Aging Family Members* - a practical guide to caregiving and *Counting on Kindness*, which helps readers comprehend the complex and often unspeakable feelings that arise when we become dependent on others for help.

Andrew Costa, PhD



Dr. Costa is the Schlegel Research Chair in Clinical Epidemiology & Aging and an Assistant Professor in the Department of Health Research Methods, Evidence and Impact and the Department of Medicine at McMaster University in Ontario, Canada. Dr. Costa's research promotes evidence-based care and health policy in geriatric care, making use of health information and technology to develop better models of care and decision support systems in home and community care, emergency departments, and acute care.

David Nace, MD, MPH



Dr. Nace is an Associate Professor and Director of Long-Term Care and Flu Programs at the University of Pittsburgh whose research focuses on infectious disease in long-term care. He is the principal investigator for a federally funded study that seeks to implement a program for and update guidelines to improve urinary tract infection management in 40 nursing homes across four states. He also serves as a co-investigator on two other federal studies to design and test a national antimicrobial stewardship toolkit for nursing facilities.

Naushira Pandya, MD, CMD



Dr. Pandya is an Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Geriatrics at Nova Southeastern University College of Osteopathic Medicine, and Medical Director of the State Veteran's Nursing Home in Florida. In addition to teaching, she has an active nursing home and ambulatory care practice in geriatrics and endocrinology. Her interests focus on bettering management of diabetes in frail, elderly patients by researching sliding-scale insulin options and reducing unneeded blood draws.

Roger Wong, MD



Dr. Wong is a Clinical Professor in the Division of Geriatric Medicine at the University of British Columbia Department of Medicine and a Consultant Physician of the Geriatric Consultation Program at Vancouver General Hospital. His research focuses on hospital medicine in vulnerable older adults, including quality improvement in acute care geriatrics. As President of the Canadian Geriatrics Society, he founded the state-of-the-art Acute Care for Elders (ACE) Unit in Vancouver, which has been implemented nationally and internationally.
