

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Student Research Showcase (Virtual Event) November 10th, 2020, 1PM-4PM

The RCN for Aging Population invites *student-led research* abstract submissions for presentation at the special Student Research Showcase on November 10, 2020, 1-4PM. This session will be the follow up of the RCN event on October 29, 2020, organized by University of Michigan Transportation Research Institute - UMTRI (Free registration link: <https://bit.ly/2FkFbxX>)

Per RCN's objective of promoting and supporting young researchers' works about the aging population, the submissions are expected to be related to the students' M.S. theses or PhD dissertations. Research projects where the student has the lead role are also accepted. The RCN focuses on three themes related to the aging population: 1) transportation, 2) public safety/emergency services, and 3) housing. Nevertheless, due to multifaceted nature of the RCN's themes, broader research topics related to aging population are also welcome.

The objectives of the Student Research Showcase virtual session are to:

- 1) disseminate the findings of near-complete/completed studies to the broad RCN audience
- 2) facilitate feedback opportunity for *works-in-progress* from the RCN's wide range of discipline expertise

Thus, the submissions of *works-in-progress* at any level (idea and problem definition stage, methodology development, preliminary findings, etc.) are more than welcome, actually *encouraged*. The presentations are expected to be about 10-15 minutes with ample time allocated for Q&A, discussion and feedback.
