The SEA Grant Law and Policy Journal is an Open Access online journal that provides a forum for the timely discussion and exploration of legal topics of relevance to the Sea Grant network of extension agents, researchers, coastal managers and users, and local decision-makers. The Journal features articles on a range of law and policy subjects related to our oceans, coasts, and Great Lakes resources, including fisheries, coastal development, coastal access, invasive species, and water quality and quantity.

Submission Process:

Students should respond to this call for papers by submitting a full, complete paper for possible inclusion in a 2023 edition of the Journal. Students who are completing papers during the Spring 2023 semester who are concerned about meeting the submission deadline should reach out to the Journal editor via email at cjanasie@olemiss.edu to discuss their paper.

Writer Guidelines:

- 1. Papers should be fewer than 15,000 words. Longer papers will be considered but are not preferred.
- 2. Papers should be formatted with Times New Roman 12-point type, with one inch margins, single-spaced.
- 3. Text and citations should conform to *The Bluebook: a Uniform System of Citation*.
- 4. Authors who reuse pictures and figures from other publications must acquire the appropriate copyright permission.
- 5. Accepted articles will be subject to peer review and edits may be suggested.
