The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at The University of Mississippi is seeking applications for a 12-month clinical fellow position. Responsibilities are expected to begin in July 2020 and include providing clinical services by assessing and treating speech, language, literacy and other related skills of clients under the mentorship of an American Speech-Language-Hearing Association Certified Speech-Language Pathologist and collaborating with University of Mississippi faculty and staff on academic and research endeavors. In addition, the University of Mississippi initiated Flagship Constellations, which are designed to bring together a wide range of faculty from across campus to address some of the most difficult and complex problems facing our nation and world. This is an excellent opportunity to work with cross-disciplinary teams to solve key, grand challenges.

The University of Mississippi is included in the elite group of Doctoral Universities - R1, or Highest Research Activity by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education - and continuously recognized over the last eleven years as one of the *Great Colleges to Work For* by The Chronicle of Higher Education (<http://www.greatcollegesprogram.com>). Qualified applicants will have a Master's degree in Speech Language Pathology from an accredited four-year college or university including all prerequisite coursework (ASHA Standard IV-A), core coursework (ASHA Standard IV-C), and supervised clinical practicum (ASHA Standard V). A minimum of 400 clock hours of supervised clinical experience in the practice of speech-language pathology including 25 hours of clinical observation, and 375 hours of direct client/patient contact in all the various areas, is preferred.
